HEBREW SCRIPTURE

Genesis 18:1-8 (The Inclusive Bible)

- ¹ In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.
- ² But the earth became chaos and emptiness, and darkness came over the face of the Deep yet the Spirit of God was brooding over the surface of the waters.
- ³ Then God said, "Light: Be!" and light was. ⁴ God saw that light was good, and God separated light from darkness. ⁵ God called the light "Day" and the darkness "Night." Evening came, and morning followed the first day.
- 6 Then God said, "Now make an expanse between the waters! Separate water from water!" So it was: 7 God made the expanse and separated the water above the expanse from the water below it. 8 God called the expanse "Sky." Evening came, and morning followed the second day.
- "Chaos and emptiness" in verse 2 is a rendering of the Hebrew phrase tohu va-bohu. When it is used elsewhere in the Hebrew scriptures, it always describes a scene of ruination and desolation. Some scholars have noted the linguistic connection between tohu, or chaos; tehom, or the Deep; and the Babylonian goddess, Tiamat. Here we find a remnant of Goddess imagery in the mysterious, watery chaos from which all life is created, echoed by the feminine Spirit of God hovering over the waters the way a bird broods over the eggs in her nest.
