### **Fonderings from Your Fastor**

"If one of you wanted to build a tower, wouldn't you first sit down and calculate the cost, to determine whether you have enough money to complete it? Otherwise, when you have laid the foundation but couldn't finish the tower, all who see it will begin to belittle you. They will say, 'Here's a person who began construction and couldn't complete it." (Luke 14:28-30, The Common English Bible.)

So by the time you read this, we will be making serious plans to gear up a year of programming at Urbandale United Church of Christ. This means Christian Education, OWL (Our Whole Lives), Confirmation, Choir and a host of other activities and programs will be in the works to make sure that we provide opportunities for all our folks to grow in the faith and to take hold of the "Life that is really Life" Jesus so clearly modeled in our scriptures. Those of us on the planning and implementation side of this effort have lofty ideas of near-100% participation and even loftier ideas of Gods Realm coming into being because of the programs we offer! (not likely, but we can dream!)

Those of us on the participation side of the equation probably have lofty ideas as well. We typically start out with high expectations, whether it be a Bible Study, worship service, class or mission project, we expect to make a difference in the world, bring salvation (whatever that means!) to the lost, or transform the injustices of the world into the peace of God, just by being present and participating. Of course, we are often disappointed when our ideals are squelched by reality that forces us to work hard, be patient, or even worse, change our expectations to accommodate new circumstances.

The parable of the person building a tower is a good governor on our idealism run rampant. While Jesus often encourages his followers to shoot for the moon and expect great things of God, he also makes sure those who follow him know what they are getting themselves into. If we are under any illusion that the way ahead is all sweetness and light, Jesus is there to remind us of some unpleasant realities that force us to count the cost. Do we have the time, inclination, and courage to follow where the Gospel leads us? Are we brave enough to find and sing a new song? Can we sing in the choir AND teach Sunday school?

Part of discipleship is recognizing where our gifts lie and how we might use our gifts to the best advantage of the ministry of the church. It consists of managing our energy and our resources and of attending to our spiritual well-being. If we burn too hot too soon, we may find ourselves peaking early and burning out before we are done. I would love to see everyone up to their eyeballs in volunteering for the work of our church, but that is not a realistic expectation. It is a recipe for burnout!

So I am going to suggest that you watch for activities and programs that really excite you. Sign up for one or two and give your full attention to what you have chosen. Make room in your day for an ongoing commitment to whatever it is. Do some homework and some meditation around this effort each day. Share what you are learning with those around you. Integrate it into your understanding of your vocation or calling.

We will be undertaking a number of things at the summer's end. Make sure that you find the time and energy to make one or two of them a part of your journey. Then when you are done and the project is completed, you will find satisfaction in work well done and be a more useful disciple in the work that God still has for you to do. Amen.

#### **UUCC SAFETY reminder**

An important mission of the Urbandale United Church of Christ congregation is to provide a safe haven for all. Trust, mutual respect, hope, and kindness guide our practices in building support and care for everyone in our church and community. Our safety policies seek to foster accountability, responsibility, and healing within our ministries. ~Child Safety Team Recommendations, p. 2

We often think of our church as a safe haven where we are protected from the harsh realities of the outside world. We must not forget that the church is still a public place where we need to be aware of our surroundings. It is important for us to know where our children are at all times and not to let them roam the church unattended. When children need to use the restroom please send them with a trusted adult or wait right outside for them. We should not take for granted the safety of our children even at church.

Please review the Safety Team's recommendations which are available on our Website <a href="http://www.urbandaleucc.org">http://www.urbandaleucc.org</a>. All of our childcare volunteers need to complete this training if they want to work with children. We are always in need of volunteers for our various children and youth ministries.

#### All volunteers who work with kids at Urbandale UCC must fill the following requirements:

- Have attended Urbandale UCC for at least 6 months prior to volunteering with children.
- Not appear as a registered sex offender on the official website.
- Not be alone with a child in the ministries of Urbandale UCC (unless the child is a member of their family or has been placed in their care by family members). There should always be two adults in a classroom, but at moments when this is not possible, you should still avoid situations where you are alone with one child.
- Attend the training required of all child care and education volunteers and staff.
- Sign a covenant following this training that indicates that they understand and agree to follow abuse prevention and reporting rules.

Modeling good boundaries, being a good listener, and creating a safe sanctuary for all people to be free is the work of Christ in our midst. Thank you for being aware of this policy and for your support in honoring this covenant with our church family. Please contact Rev. Amy if you have any questions or want to volunteer with our youth.
