

Ponderings from Your Pastor

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts, so that we in turn might make known the glory of God shining on the face of Christ. (II Corinthians 4:6, The Inclusive Bible.)

Light is one of the most powerful metaphors for all that is good and uplifting about faith. Whether we think of it in terms of truth, or understanding, or hope, or holiness, "light" seems to figure strongly in the experience of the Transcendent Presence we sometimes call "God."

But it is also very clear that our faith expects that we, ourselves, will shine! We sing with gusto and fervor, "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine!" refusing to hide it under a bushel, allow Satan to blow it out, or neglect to keep it burning even in the dead of night.

In Second Corinthians, Paul uses the light of God's Glory that Christians experience in the "face of Christ" as the unifying principle of a community that had started to unravel. He reminded them that we are all "clay jars" (Earthen vessels in the King James Bible) so that they would cut each other a little slack, and keep in mind that the Light of God shines in us all!

Maybe that's why the planners for next summer's 32nd General Synod of the United Church of Christ have chosen "Shine!" to be the central theme of the meeting, with the sub-title, "Let your light shine before others" (Matthew 5:16) as a scriptural lynchpin. We understand that our faith and our witness to what is true and just in the world should never be hidden or concealed from those who so desperately need to see it. It is an imperative of our tradition that we become bearers of the light as soon as we receive it!

The Synod will take place June 21st through 25th next summer in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It is close enough that a lot of us could attend and I am encouraging you to make time for it right now, before you start planning vacations and camps and other activities. People routinely come back from Synod excited and eager to try new ideas and share new insights. If we get enough people to go, we may be able to share transportation expenses and divvy up some of the reading about resolutions and proposals (which can be a little daunting!).

At this point, there are not a lot of details available, other than dates and location. If you are interested in following the event, go to ucc.org and click on General Synod. You can opt for automatic updates and keep abreast of scheduled speakers, musicians, business and preachers. And perhaps most important of all, you will have the opportunity at Synod to participate in some of the most moving experiences of worship that you have ever known – powerful preaching, exciting music, engaging stories, and transformational testimonies! Many people have been launched into new journeys of faith by attending a meeting of the General Synod!

So I hope you will make room for the Light! Let it shine on you and transform you. I also hope you will embrace your calling to let your light shine, whether or not you attend General Synod. Be on the lookout for people who are searching for the Light you can reflect to them. Be aware that the vessel that holds the light doesn't have to be perfect, or unbreakable or holy. It just has to be open to letting the Light shine before others.

Where can your light shine today? Amen.

Are you ready to put your faith in to action? Youth and adults ages 15 and older are invited to join us as we head to the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Reservation next summer with the UCC endorsed agency, Simply Smiles. If you are interested in attending please join us for an informational meeting the evening of Thursday, November 1st, 6:30-8:00 pm in the sanctuary at UUCC. A Simply Smiles representative will share further details about the trip and answer our questions. We have 15 youth and adults already interested and can take up to 30 participants. Here's a little bit more from the website and what you can expect.

As a volunteer, you will spend one week working with us at the Sam D. Horse Community Center in La Plant and at nearby homes and project sites. The Community Center serves as the hub of activity for the week. The days are split into three parts:

Mornings: Revolves around work projects. Under the guidance of Simply Smiles staff, you will be working on projects ranging from cement-mixing to new home construction.

Afternoons: After a hearty lunch, the second part of the day is devoted to running summer camp, filled with arts & crafts, basketball, a game of tag and other fun ways to connect with the kids.

Evenings: In the evenings you will help us to host town-wide meals, BINGO night, movie night and more!

Working Hard

You will work side by side with the people you have traveled so far to help. You will learn new things (like cement mixing) and push yourself to do things you may never have thought you could do (like build a new home).

You don't need any special skills to have a meaningful and successful week. Simply Smiles staffers will be right there with you to teach you the skills you'll need. Be prepared to be surprised at how well you learn to put on a roof or use a power-tool! Volunteers just like you have built entire homes, basketball courts, community centers and more!

Cultural Immersion

On the Cheyenne River Reservation, you will have the unique opportunity to learn about and experience the beautiful Lakota culture firsthand.

During your week on the Reservation, you might have the chance to listen to a Lakota drumming ceremony, meet artisans who craft stunning jewelry and dreamcatchers, hear stories that have been passed down for generations, or witness a powwow with traditional dancing.

The stories of the Lakota people's past and present struggles will challenge your preconceptions and force you to rethink our nation's history. You'll feel honored to be invited into this special culture that for too long was forced into oblivion. And you'll be thankful to know the people who are fighting to keep it alive.

The Book Club will be meeting Monday, October 16th from 6-8 pm at Beaverdale Books, 2629 Beaver Ave. This month's book is, "The Cellist of Sarajevo" by Steven Galloway.

"In a city under siege, four people whose lives have been upended are ultimately reminded of what it is to be human. From his window, a musician sees twenty-two of his friends and neighbors waiting in a breadline. Then, in a flash, they are killed by a mortar attack. In an act of defiance, the man picks up his cello and decides to play at the site of the shelling for twenty-two days, honoring their memory. Elsewhere, a young man leaves home to collect drinking water for his family and, in the face of danger, must weigh the value of generosity against selfish survivalism. A third man, older, sets off in search of bread and distraction and instead runs into a long-ago friend who reminds him of the city he thought he had lost, and the man he once was. As both men are drawn into the orbit of cello music, a fourth character—a young woman, a sniper—holds the fate of the cellist in her hands. As she protects him with her life, her own army prepares to challenge the kind of person she has become.

A novel of great intensity and power, and inspired by a true story, The Cellist of Sarajevo poignantly explores how war can change one's definition of humanity, the effect of music on our emotional endurance, and how a romance with the rituals of daily life can itself be a form of resistance."
