#### SCRIPTURE LESSON

#### Isaiah 35:4-7 (The Inclusive Bible)

- <sup>4</sup> Say to all those of faint heart: "Take courage! Do not be afraid! Look, YHWH is coming, vindication is coming, the recompense of God God is coming to save you!"
- <sup>5</sup> Then the eyes of the blind will be opened, the ears of the deaf will be unsealed.
- <sup>6</sup> Then those who cannot walk will leap like deer and the tongues of those who cannot speak will sing for joy.

Waters will break forth in the wilderness, and there will be streams in the desert.

This passage presents a difficulty in that the language and style of chapters 34 and 35 are of a much later period than what precedes and follows them. They could almost stand alone as oracles of judgment against Edom contrasted with God's saving actions toward the conquered people of Israel. Some scholars speculate that Edom must have had some hand in the destruction of Jerusalem to warrant such a harsh judgment, but there is no other Biblical or historical evidence of this.
