Ponderings from your Pastor

When the magi had departed, an angel from the lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up. Take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod will soon search for the child in order to kill him." (Matthew 2:13, The Common English Bible)

Lately, I have found that I think more and more about how living our faith makes a difference in the world. So many problems seem intractable. Poverty and hunger persist. Violence and hate are rampant. The environment is assaulted on multiple fronts. Refugees are a constant reality. People I admire and respect turn out to be more human than I want them to be. People I love face challenges and setbacks and even death itself. How does a person continue to believe in "Good News" when the world is so consumed by what can only be thought of as bad news?

The story of the Magi is a good example. It is an uplifting story about one of the elements of the birth of Jesus that we love to hear. Wise, educated aristocrats, well-versed in prophesy and astrology, (and loaded to boot!) come to Bethlehem and acknowledge Jesus as a new king. They leave expensive gifts and have the political savvy to know not to let Herod know where Jesus is. That's when the story turns unexpectedly macabre. Herod is furious! So much so that he uses the forces at his disposal to commit mass murder among his own people!

I sometimes wonder if the Magi ever found out about this. Did their sources from Palestine tell them about that terrible day when the soldiers came – when the innocent were cut down just when their lives had begun? Did they feel the pangs of guilt for having introduced Herod to his own fear of losing his power? Had they heard the angels sing "Peace on Earth" and then wonder what the heck went wrong? There is an old Christmas carol (I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day) that says, "And in despair I hung my head. 'There is no peace on earth,' I said. For hate is strong and mocks the song of Peace on Earth, Goodwill to men." (sic)

Maybe we set ourselves up for disappointment by thinking too much about the glitter, tinsel and ribbon that we have used to adorn what is essentially a fierce struggle. The Word becomes flesh and lives in the middle of humanity, where there are fears and hatreds that warp what God has created. God reaches into our existence and unveils a reality that stands in stark contrast to what we expect – a reality in which love overrides the anxious striving of humanity. Our fears and doubts and hatreds and insecurities are exposed for the ridiculous farces they truly are. And if we cannot let go of them, we become angry and frightened and behave in callous and cruel ways.

What is tragic about all this is not that the birth of Jesus made no difference (it did!). The tragedy is that we humans have been shown the path to peace and are continually seduced by the world's glitter and tinsel of power and wealth. The fact that the world is not a peaceful, prosperous, idyllic place says more about our lack of faith than God's inability to come up with a good plan!

My celebration this year will be an embrace of the struggle. It will be a refusal to cave in to the voices of fear and suspicion. I will sing the carols and deck the halls and bake the cookies, and be for those around me an example of how to be Peace on Earth. And if it seems that no one is listening or watching or caring, I will remember that once, a long time ago, Magi came to Bethlehem.

Merry Christmas. Amen

So, I am thankful Leadership Team just approved the replacement of several of our **furnaces** and air conditioners—all funded by the Building on the Promise Campaign. These replacements will help make our building significantly more energy efficient and reduce our carbon footprint. So, expect changes to be happening this winter. Gordon & other B&G members have also worked at plugging the gaps, often in difficult places.

In choir recently, we were practicing "In the Bleak Midwinter," the one that flows in a minor key. Remember how it goes?

What can I give him, poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.

And it hit me—Gordon was like that shepherd in his giving.

And the next words struck close to home too.

What I can I give him:

Give him my heart.

What would it look like to really *give my heart*?

Would I crack open that pocketbook a little wider? Would I let go of one of my *extras* so the church could meet *needs*? When I hear about something that needs done, could I say, "Hey, that's something I could help with," and pitch in?

At our stewardship luncheon Nov. 11, we collected 68 pledges for a total of \$229,414. There is always a gap between the initial pledge drive results, and the final budget. The 2018 budget relies on \$306,476 from 106 pledges. Can you help fill the gap?




Youth at General Synod 32 June 21-25, 2019, Milwaukee, Wisconsin

2019 Our Whole Lives K-2nd Grades Parent Informational Meeting

Please mark your calendar for a Parent Informational Meeting for <u>Sunday</u>, <u>December 2nd at 11am in Fellowship Hall</u>. We will get to know one another, share the curriculum, schedule, expectations and discuss any questions. The program will run on Sundays from 11am-12:30pm immediately following church beginning **Sunday**, **January 6th**, **2019** and conclude with a celebration and recognition in worship on **Sunday**, **March 3rd**, **2019**.

Our Whole Lives (OWL) K-2: This program affirms all kinds of families and helps children identify and avoid sexual abuse. It supports parents in educating children about birth, babies, bodies, families and learning how to be an "Askable Parent." Following a Parent Meeting and Parent/Child Orientation, the 8 sessions engage children with stories, songs and activities and include a weekly HomeLink - a homework project for parents and children to do together and promotes dialogue between parent and child.

OWL helps participants to build interpersonal skills and understand the spiritual, emotional and social aspects of sexuality. The curriculum is based on the Guidelines for Comprehensive Sexuality Education produced by the National Guidelines Task Force, a group of leading health, education and sexuality professionals assembled by the Sexuality Information and Education Council of the United States.

This truly is a gift to our congregation and I want to thank Bonita Wiley, Stacy Anderson and Mary Minard for being our leaders. This program is available to the community as part of our Strategic Plan goals. Please share this date with others who may be interested.
