Matthew 2:1-12 (The Inclusive Bible)

#### SCRIPTURE LESSON

<sup>1</sup>After Jesus' Birth – which happened in Bethlehem of Judea, during the reign of Herod – astrologers from the East arrived in Jerusalem <sup>2</sup>and asked, "Where is the newborn ruler of the Jews? We observed his star at its rising and have come to pay homage." <sup>3</sup>At this news Herod became greatly disturbed, as did all of Jerusalem. <sup>4</sup>Summoning all the chief priests and religious scholars of the people, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born.

<sup>5</sup>"In Bethlehem of Judea," they informed him. "Here is what the prophet has written:

<sup>6</sup><sup>4</sup>And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, since from you will come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.""

<sup>7</sup>Herod called the astrologers aside and found out from them the exact time of the star's appearance. <sup>8</sup>Then he sent them to Bethlehem, after having instructed them, "Go and get detailed information about the child. When you have found him, report back to me – so that I may go and offer homage, too."

<sup>9</sup>After their audience with the ruler, they set out. The star which they had observed at its rising went ahead of them until it came to a standstill over the place where the child lay. <sup>10</sup>They were overjoyed at seeing the star and, <sup>11</sup>upon entering the house, found the child with Mary, his mother. They prostrated themselves and paid homage. Then they opened their coffers and presented the child with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

<sup>12</sup>They were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, so they went back to their own country by another route.

In this passage, Matthew makes clear that Herod, who is not a descendant of David, is not a legitimate ruler, while Jesus' legitimacy is attested by the visitors who have recognized his star. There are also clear echoes of the story of Moses in the killing of baby boys (Vss. 16-18), opposition of a powerful ruler (Vs. 13), and a journey out of Egypt (Vs. 15).
