### **SCRIPTURE LESSON**

John 3:1-17 (The Inclusive Bible)

<sup>1</sup>A certain Pharisee named Nicodemus, a member of the Sanhedrin, <sup>2</sup> came to Jesus at night. "Rabbi," he said, "we know you're a teacher come from God, for no one can perform the signs and wonders you do, unless by the power of God."

<sup>3</sup> Jesus gave Nicodemus this answer:

"The truth of the matter is, unless one is born from above, one cannot see the kindom of God."

<sup>4</sup> Nicodemus said, "How can an adult be born a second time? I can't go back into my mother's womb to be born again!"

<sup>5</sup> Jesus replied:

"The truth of the matter is, no one can enter God's kindom without being born of water and the Spirit.

<sup>6</sup> What is born of the flesh is flesh; what is born of the Spirit is Spirit.

<sup>7</sup> So don't be surprised when I tell you that you must be born from above.

<sup>8</sup> The wind blows where it will. You hear the sound it makes, but you don't know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

<sup>12</sup> If you don't believe when I tell you about earthly things,

how will you believe when I tell you about heavenly things?

<sup>13</sup> No one has gone up to heaven

except the One who came down from heaven – the Chosen One.

<sup>14</sup> As Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so the Chosen One must be lifted up,

<sup>15</sup> so that everyone who believes in the Chosen One might have eternal life.

<sup>16</sup> Yes, God so loved the world as to give the Only Begotten One,

that whoever believes may not die, but have eternal life.

<sup>17</sup> God sent the Only Begotten into the world not to condemn the world,

but that through the Only Begotten, the world might be saved."

In addition to the prose in John's Gospel,, there are long sections that have a poetic, almost lyrical tone. Most Greek texts do not make a distinction between these, but the editors of The Inclusive Bible have chosen to print these poetic sections by strophe, indicating that they are to be read with attention to meter and phrasing. How does treating these sections as poetry affect your understanding of the message?
