SCRIPTURE

Mark 1:14-20 (The Inclusive Bible)

¹⁴After John's arrest, Jesus appeared in Galilee proclaiming the Good News of God: ¹⁵"This is the time of fulfillment. The reign of God is at hand! Change your hearts and minds, and believe this Good News!"

¹⁶While walking by the Sea of Galilee, Jesus saw the brothers Simon and Andrew casting their nets into the sea, since they fished by trade. ¹⁷Jesus said to them, "Follow me; I will make you fishers of humankind." ¹⁸They immediately abandoned their nets and followed Jesus.

¹⁹ Proceeding a little further along, Jesus saw the brothers James and John Bar-Zebedee. They too were in their boat, putting their nets in order. ²⁰ Immediately Jesus called them, and they left their father Zebedee standing in the boat with the hired help, and went off in the company of Jesus.

The Inclusive Bible uses the phrase, "Change your hearts and minds" where many translations use the word, "repent." The Greek word in this instance is metanoia, which does contain the root for "change" (like metamorphosis) and the word for "thinking and being" (like paranoia). In many religious circles, the word "repent!" as an imperative has acquired a very narrow meaning having to do with guilt and shame and tearful apologies. There is nothing in this passage to suggest that this is what Jesus had in mind.
