Dear Church,

August is a month in which many are pushing to finish their summer activities and a month to dive into planning for the fall. I am in both camps!

I will be on vacation August 16-22. It has been a couple of years since I was able to get to Washington to see my daughter, son-in-law, and grandchildren. I am excited to see the mountains and, maybe, some salt water, and to reconnect with this part of my family.

Many of my thoughts are directed towards the program year and what can happen next. As the Pastoral Search Team gets their feet on the ground, the congregation's work is to keep being the church! How can we connect with and inform people who have a particular interest in areas of justice and service? This means using Realm, our database system, to greater advantage. There will be more coming about getting on Realm, how to use it, and how to be in groups for information sharing and action.

This congregation has emerged over the last year and half as one that is not simply surviving. You are lively and vital to your neighbors. You care and you have passionate responses to the needs around you. You laugh and work together. You are willing to try new things. You, above all else, are beloved.

Youth Update

Q&A Youth Group

Q&A stands for Queer and Affirming. Q&A stands for Questions and Answers. New Beginnings Christian Church and Downtown Disciples invited Urbandale UCC to be part of an ecumenical effort to create a progressive youth group for elementary, middle school, and high school youths. Okay, that turns out to be several groups. All the congregations involved are Open and Affirming Congregations – a description used by the United Church of Christ and by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

A planning group has been meeting since June to give shape to the idea of a shared ministry.

Right now, the plan is to have gatherings on Wednesday evenings twice a month. A meal will be served followed by program activities focused on key shared values like justice and kindness. During that time, there will be space for parents and caregivers to have supportive conversations.

The group is committed to meeting at a site other than one of our church buildings for several reasons. First, Downtown Disciples doesn't have a church building. Second, when one group "owns" the space others never feel completely welcome. Third, we know that religion may have cast youth out for being themselves and we want them to find a welcoming space.

There will be plenty of opportunities for volunteers from each of the congregations. There will be a need to set up space, prepare and serve food, and supervise participants. We will need group leaders for the program time for three different groups. Our hope is that we can have a friendly face from each congregation with each group, at least at the beginning. We may need extra help cleaning up at the end of the evening.

This is a very exciting opportunity for us and our youths. Stay tuned.

CHILD CARE - HELP WANTED


Good news! Urbandale UCC would like to reopen our Sunday morning nursery and childcare on September 10. We are seeking a reliable, caring individual to staff the nursery.

Suds of Love

"I haven't been able to wash my clothes in a washing machine for over three years. I have been washing them in my sink. I will take my clean clothes home and sit down and cry."

St. Paul Congregational United Church of Christ in Oskaloosa is offering a powerful ministry of love and hospitality they call "Suds of Love." St. Paul member Heather Fogle and Pastor Rev. Melissa Sternhagen were instrumental in starting this project. Suds of Love strives to improve the community by connecting with people in a place where everyone is welcomed-serving all people by providing free laundry, cleaning supplies, hygiene items, and food so everyone can meet their basic needs. All are worthy. There are no criteria to meet, and no strings attached. Come as you are and support each other.

I had heard about towns who would provide quarters, soap, and dryer sheets at a local laundromat for those in need. I spoke with and observed a group in Newton, IA who did this. I talked with Pastor Melissa Sternhagen, about doing this in Oskaloosa. She loved the idea and had me talk with the church council. They were excited and gave me about a month and a half to get it scheduled and going. Pastor Melissa gave wonderful insight and guidance in getting this off the ground and the congregation of St. Paul was beyond supportive with time, money, and prayers.

We started off doing this every other month providing quarters, soap, dryer sheets and a small amount of hygiene items. We have grown into every month and now provide a large list of hygiene items, cleaning supplies, snacks, and bread. We just started providing free transportation to and from Suds of Love for those who need it. We have served families, college students, veterans, individuals, those living in hotels, cars and on the street. We have many people who come every month and it is truly becoming a family.

Hope and love are spreading through people one load of laundry at a time

Local businesses and individuals have donated generously. We have partnered with First Christian Church and have a group, the Suds Buds, that heads up Suds of Love. The Grinnell, Iowa UCC is starting their own Suds of Love and another church in Sigourney, IA is starting a Suds of Love there.


