## PONDERINGS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Church,

When I interviewed to be the interim minister here at Urbandale UCC, I learned about you through the website as well as in other ways. One thing I noted was this statement: "Together, we commit ourselves to affirm the tenets of the Christian faith." There are several other commitments named, but this one caught my attention. I asked the Search Team what they would say are the tenets of the Christian faith. If there was a "stump the Search Team" moment, that was it.

I've recently been reading *Stealing Jesus* by Bruce Bawer. This is certainly not a new book, but it called to me from the bookshelf. Bawer describes two streams of United States Christianity that he identifies as legalistic and nonlegalistic – a Church of Law and a Church of Love. He adds the disclaimer that no one is 100% either one, but certain ideas dominate in each one. This concept is only to underscore that the "tenets of the Christian faith" may differ from person to person. I think that can be wonderful as long as we are willing to share our ideas. This has led me to wonder "what do WE believe."

Some of us grew up learning, memorizing, and reciting the Apostles' or Nicene Creed and sometimes both. These two creeds have been the staple of Christian belief for centuries. I can be in a worship service and willingly join the congregation in one of these testaments of faith. I will also confess that I would not, myself, offer either one as my personal statement of faith. As a community we can believe many things as a whole body even when individually we may have some differences of opinion. I appreciate that Confirmation students are often asked to write a personal statement of faith. That statement may well change over a lifetime. I hope so.

This September, I invite you to explore Statements of Faith, starting with the United Church of Christ Statement of Faith. I will include a portion of this statement in each worship service. I invite you to think about what you would say you believe about a Triune God or One God. Do you think you are more Church of Love or Church of Law without having details about what that includes? And, on top of that, I will invite you to explore the Divine with your senses in new ways and with the ones we ignore too often.

I've named this series "We Believe...We Are Not Alone." Let's take this September journey together.

I'm excited by this chance to explore faith and experiences of the Sacred! I'm also excited that on September 29 I leave for a study leave in Ireland. I will be learning about Celtic Women, Celtic spirituality, and touching on the subject of the Feminine Divine. I also look forward to sharing about this journey in October.

- 3. Provide Christian faith-based programming around the teaching of Jesus for participants of all ages. This programming will include a progressive Christian curriculum through various mediums.


**WHEN?** Second and fourth Wednesdays, September 13 & 27, from 5:30-7 pm. This program runs September-May 2024

#### NEIGHBORS IN NEED SPECIAL OFFERING

Neighbors in Need is one of the four special offerings of the United Church of Christ. The designated date is October 1 which is also World Communion Sunday, a great time to focus on our local, regional, and global neighbors. One-third of the offering helps support the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC congregations and organizations, as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.



This year's focus is on environmental justice. Plastics, electronics, and other noncompostable wastes are being shipped across and even tossed into our waterways, launched into space, as well as buried in landfills. As people of faith, we believe these egregious acts are sinful and unholy. We must be better stewards of our planet!

Urbandale UCC is applying for a grant this year to help with the start-up of Q&A Progressive Christian Youth from Neighbors in Need as a project of Advocacy and Outreach for Justice Work.

## REFUGEE MINISTRY

Our group would like to give you an update on the refugee family that you have so generously supported. As we stated in previous reports, the mother of this family decided to seek asylum in this country after it was discovered that she and some of her friends were assisting Ukrainian refugees by giving them food, clothing, and trying to assist them with medical needs.

The mother of this family is strong and resourceful. She has found a number of temporary jobs and has earned enough money to pay for her own car insurance. She continues to explore the possibilities that may eventually allow her to get her cosmetology license in Iowa to return to the profession she had in her country of origin. She is hard-working and

will do her best to contribute to her rent and childcare in the future, but at this point, she continues to need some assistance.

The members of our group continue to do work with USCRI, the resettlement agency we are partnered with. The newest arrivals have been from Africa, most often the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In the next few months, we anticipate assisting with transportation to get children to immunization appointments and to schools for enrollment.

There have been fairly large numbers of arrivals in the last few months, so donations are always needed to help the families get set up in apartments, etc. Currently, they are very low on items for the kitchen, such as dishes and silverware, and they are also in need of cleaning supplies and personal hygiene products.

As always, please know that we are so grateful for the support you offer us and the new members of our community.


